Description:

Christ Church Cathedral has been at the heart of Waterford City since the 10th Century when the Vikings built the first Church on the site. The restored and refurbished cathedral is a magnificent 18th Century building designed by John Roberts. The building is steeped in the heritage and history of Waterford with medieval tombs, memorial wall plaques, and beautiful stucco plasterwork ceiling. A regular programme of concerts and recitals takes place at the cathedral through out the year.

Description:

Designed by John Roberts and built in 1793, the Cathedral of the Most Holy Trinity is over 2 centuries old and is Ireland's oldest Catholic cathedral (being the first Catholic cathedral to be built after the reformation) In 2000, the square near Barronstrand Street (formerly known as " Red Square ") was renamed as "John Roberts Square " in light of the influence he had over the architecture of the two cathedrals in Waterford.

Description:

Reginald's Tower is the oldest civic urban structure in Ireland and has played a pivotal role in the country's history. The precursor of this tower is believed to be Dundory, a Viking fortification built on this site during the 10th century. This early fort formed the apex of the triangular Viking settlement and was in all probability a port for Viking longboats. It was strategically located on the high ground between a tidal inlet or branch of St. John's river in the south east
